



Why is it that as I try to type this message, my brain suddenly seems to stop functioning? My hands feel stiff, my fingers barely move, as if the letters on the keyboard have shifted positions. The words in my head, and in my heart, the ones that used to buzz and sing with me, the words I used to love to read and write, seem to have disappeared. I feel a little lost, a little numb, facing a sheer shortage of words. No words are enough to express how grateful and thankful our team is for the adventurous, learning and awesome year we have experienced!

However, I do know where to begin. It takes me back to the roots, 18 years ago, when young people filled with hope in their hearts, fire in their souls, and strength in their muscles, stood up for their fellow youth, setting an example for everyone around the world. They embarked on a mission to start a youth-led, youth-run organization. Many may have considered it a foolish idea—how could young people lead? How could they run an organization? Who would trust them? Why should they be trusted? Why the need for a youth movement when the older ones are doing just fine? Despite these questions and barriers, YUWA was established in 2009. Fourteen years have passed, and the same questions persist. We've done our best to address the questions, including those mentioned above, and many others that were thrown at us. These questions tore at our souls, attempted to weaken us, we might have even stumbled, but we have examples of our alumni who fought through it all. They proved everyone wrong and demonstrated that young people are not just the future, but the present. They're not just here to question, but to provide answers. The lived experiences of young people, their unique ideas, and the fire in their hearts were more than enough. Young people!

A heartfelt thank you to the co-founders for establishing this organization and igniting the youth movement in the country. Thank you to all the alumni, staff, and members upon whose shoulders the organization firmly rests. Without you, many of us might have been lost, with no hope, under the shadow of the status quo.

The first year was about learning. We delved into strengthening youth involvement and nurturing the next generation of leaders. Fine new members are added to the team - new rays of hope! This year, like every other year, we persist in challenging the status quo at local, national, regional, and international levels. We propel the youth movement forward through the lens of substantive equality in all areas: access/opportunity, participation, and results with 8 standing projects and aligning youth movements. YUWA has successfully become a haven for young people—a space where they can come, participate, act, make mistakes, learn, and grow. We will always be a home for young people.

Not confined to the national level, YUWA also extended its work and advocacy efforts to regional and international levels. At Women Deliver, we had the opportunity to represent as the host organization of the Women Deliver Asia Regional Steering Committee. Our works, voices, and values were reflected through the exhibition booth, concurrent session and community space. This has undoubtedly paved

the way for international advocacy for youth movement for the upcoming generations of leaders. This year special efforts were made to strengthen our relationships with government agencies, and this has been evident in our recent work. YUWA has recognized the need to expand the reach of our work at all provincial and local levels, and we are strategically working towards that goal. We have also been able to identify our other strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats in the present social, political, economic, and cultural context. As the shrinkage of civic spaces and both subtle and substantial backlashes in the feminist youth movement persist, we're navigating this complex context and strategically working to sustain the youth movement while transcending the barriers. To transcend these challenges, we're seeking not just policy reform, but also structural and systemic change amidst the influence of globalization, capitalism, necropolitics, and climate change in the current context.

Our Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights department, Active Citizenship department, and Research Unit have opened new avenues and work relentlessly to do better and be better. We have also realized the need for the improvement and expansion of the Research Unit.

There are many gaps and challenges that need addressing, and we promise to work on these as a team-enriching meaningful and inclusive youth participation by including young people from all diversity. As we step into another youth-led, youth-run year at YUWA, we are assured that we will continue to receive your utter guidance, interrogation, and support.

Thematic Areas of YUWA

ACTIVE CITIZENSHIP (iii)

Active citizenship (AC) is one of the three thematic areas of YUWA, and it is a foundation program through which other ideas crossconnect. It works to empower the youth to become more aware of the issues in the country and also aims to make them active citizens that work to improve their communities and society as a whole. It focuses on building youth leadership and raising the voice of the youth. Within Active Citizenship, we have various initiatives such as Prarambha, Pahichan, YUWA Awashar, CYS and YUWA Manthan.

Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) is an important thematic area that advocates for youth issues on sexual and reproductive health and rights. It works to increase awareness about Comprehensive Sexuality Education, HIV/AIDS, LGBTQI rights and gender equality. There are many initiatives under SRHR- Khulla Akash, Reaching Out Young Minds, Youth Activist Leadership Council and Right Here Right Now.

RESEARCH UNIT

In the pursuit of fostering active citizenship and advancing Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) in Nepal, the Research Unit has undertaken a comprehensive array of surveys and research initiatives over the past year. Our dedicated team has been steadfast in the collection of data, information, and anecdotes, employing rigorous scientific methodologies to shed light on the diverse facets of our focus areas.

Organizational Strategic Planning

The recently constituted executive board for the term 2022-2024 convened at Dhulikhel Village Resort for a comprehensive strategic planning session. The primary objectives of this meeting were multifaceted, encompassing team-building exercises, organizational assessment, a critical review of the existing five-year strategy, stakeholder mapping and analysis, as well as the monitoring and evaluation of the Integrated Strategic Plan and Integrated Operational Plan.







The Right Here, Right Now (RHRN) 2 coalition, a strategic partnership between Rutgers, The Asian-Pacific Resource & Research Centre for Women (ARROW), CHOICE for Youth and Sexuality (CHOICE), dance4life, Humanist Institute for Co-operation with Developing Countries (Hivos), The International Planned Parenthood Federation Africa Region (IPPFAR), Latin American and Caribbean Women's Health Network (LACWHN), and the Dutch Minister of Foreign Affairs, has been at the forefront of advancing Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR). 


